Slavery Still Exists: Norma Dhanaraj ('01)

Let me tell you the story of a woman I met one summer. To protect this woman's identity, I will call her Katie. Katie was a fourteen-year-old girl walking home from school when a young man stopped her to tell her how beautiful she looked. That week, he continued to converse with Katie after school. He gained more of her trust each day, and it was not long before he convinced Katie to escape all of her typical fourteen-year-old troubles by taking a trip with him. It was during the trip that he revealed his actual plans for her. Already halfway across the country, Katie was told that she would be joining other women, forced to sell her body, and expected to meet nightly quotas. The alternative was to be severely beaten and to face the threat of her family being harmed. Katie became yet another missing child and victim of modern day slavery. She was a United States citizen stripped of her identity, under the control of a pimp, and trafficked within the United States. Like Katie, an estimated two hundred thousand people live as victims of modern day slavery in the United States. Each year, nearly 800,000 human beings are trafficked across the world's borders through the network of today's fastest growing criminal industry.

Last year, I interned at the State Department's Office to Monitor and Combat Trafficking in Persons. A representative from that office had introduced me to the issue of human trafficking when she spoke at Stone Ridge during my final year of high school. Her descriptions of interviewing

women in brothels, along with my Catholic education, motivated me to become active in fighting this injustice.

In the summer of 2007, I had a Fellowship position at Polaris Project, a nongovernmental organization that fights human trafficking in the spirit of a modern day Underground Railroad.

I worked overnight shifts at Polaris Project's transitional housing facility for trafficking survivors and helped reach out to potential victims at the courthouse who had been arrested on solicitation and pandering charges. Many of the survivors were *my age*. One of them was seventeen years old, and she would tell me stories about fighting off as many as ten men at one time. Even now, she struggles with resorting to violence every time she has a problem. Most of the women had been forced into prostitution when they were thirteen years old, the average age of entry into prostitution in the United States. Some of the women had children who had been born while the women were still being forced to meet nightly quotas under the control of a pimp. One of them had been held with a gun to her head and forced to commit murder. As I grew close to these women and learned about their horrifying experiences, I learned that most women do not choose to be in prostitution, and most are desperate to leave it.

In the beginning, the women tried to trick me about the rules of the housing program. I remember feeling distant from them, but we soon developed friendship and respect for one another. The women realized that my attitude

and actions went beyond fulfilling a job description, and I realized that even though I was responsible for protecting these women, they were just as protective of me. I felt safe and at home with these women. They cared for me as much as I cared for them.

I tried to make use of all that I had learned with a proposal to Saint Anselm College for a "Slavery Still Exists Campaign" in New Hampshire. Our campaign focused our efforts on breaking down widespread misconceptions that enhance the problem of modern day slavery, such as the glamorization of pimps in pop culture.

Through these experiences, I have learned that there is hope for overcoming the injustice that exists in our world, and this hope lives in every person. Pope John Paul II summed up this hope when he said, "The world you are inheriting is a world that desperately needs a new sense of human solidarity. It is a world that needs to be touched and healed by the beauty and richness of God's love. It needs witnesses to that love. The world needs salt. It needs you to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world." I will always be grateful to have witnessed God's love in the women I met that summer.

The 2008 *Designing Our Future* Middle States report that was submitted in December to the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Elementary Schools is in the school office and is available for you to review.

Saint Andrew's students have raised over \$3000 for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy research.

All the former members of the Saint Andrew's band will be proud to know that it's hats off and congratulations to our students in the school band. On March 29, they competed in the annual Archdiocesan Band Festival held at Saint John's College High School where the judges awarded the Saint Andrew's band a superior rating! I want to give special thanks to our band director, Ms. Maloney, for her talent and dedication to these students as they develop their musical talent.

Congratulations also go to 4th grade student, Ruben Moreno. Ruben entered the world's largest youth poetry and art contest, *River of Words*, and was named one of two finalists from Maryland. Each year, in affiliation with The Library of Congress, *River of Words*, conducts a free international poetry and art contest for youth on the theme of **WATERSHEDS**. The contest is designed to help youth explore the natural and cultural history of the place they live, and to express, through poetry and art, what they discover. The contest is open to any child in the world, from 5-19 years of age. Poetry submissions are judged by *River of Words* co-founders Robert Hass, who served as US Poet Laureate from 1995-1997, and writer Pamela Michael. Art entries are judged by children's book writer and illustrator, Thacher Hurd.

These are just a few examples of events and achievements at Saint Andrew Apostle School during this past school year. Our parish and school communities are actively involved in the life of the school and their ongoing service to the school students, staff and administration enriches all our lives. Our priests are very visible in the school and spend classroom and free time with the students. The students have regular opportunities to plan and celebrate liturgies and the Sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated throughout the year.
