New Saint Andrew's Pastor Vows to Reach Every Soul *Father Dan Leary hopes to bring together church community and captivate new members* *By Kristin Thorne ('96)*

We live in a world where we constantly say no to things.

No, I'm too busy. No, I have other plans. No, maybe another time.

Well, in the world of Saint Andrew's new pastor, Father Dan Leary, the word "no" is as common as "supercalifragilisticexpialidocious."

And the reasoning behind it is simple:

"When you say 'yes' God does all the beautiful work," Father Leary said.

That was his reasoning when the Church asked him to leave his position as pastor of a church in Calvert County and take on a new assignment - pastor of Saint Andrew Apostle.

"How can you say no?" he said.

It was last July and Father Leary came in with a clear sense of what he wanted to accomplish: bring current parishioners back into the Church, inspire new ones to come in, and create a sense of community.

His work motto: reaching "one soul at a time."

And he lives by it. Father Leary spends a lot of time reaching out to students at Saint Andrew's. He referred to getting to know them and calling them by their names as a "blessing."

He also spends a large portion of his day counseling individual parishioners on anything and everything that's going on in their lives. He

tries to heal people because he wants them to go out and live like Jesus, serving others.

"You're not healed to sit on the bench. You're healed to get in the ball game," he said.

All of this religious language may sound like it would be coming from someone who always knew he wanted to be in the priesthood. But that couldn't be further from the truth.

Father Leary said growing up he never had thoughts about becoming a priest and didn't go to church routinely. He was your normal kid. One of six children. He went to Little Flower School, Georgetown Prep, and then on to Villanova University majoring in English.

It was after college when Father Leary started going to church regularly and volunteering, tutoring, and making sandwiches for the hungry.

During one Lenten Season when he was about 22, Father Leary said he had a huge conversion and God entered his life. It was all so sudden and a complete surprise.

"That was God's plan. What do you do? All of a sudden God is banging on your door," he said.

One morning he got up and decided to go to the seminary at Mount Saint Mary's in Emmitsburg, Maryland.

Five years later, at 27, he was ordained.

And now, at 44, he is embarking on another great adventure at Saint Andrew's.

"I want people to be proud [of the parish]," he said.

He's thinking about doing some cookouts and developing ways to inspire people to come to the Sacraments.

He said he wants everyone to start a new beginning together.

From the Principal's Desk: Susan Sheehan

Dear Alumni,

When asked to write a summary of the past school year for our alumni, I am amazed at how quickly time has passed. In just a few short weeks, our 8th graders will be graduating and the school will be working to finalize assignments, clean out closets, and tidy classrooms for the close of the school year. The 2011-2012 school year has been an especially memorable one for me since it marks my first year as Principal of Saint Andrew Apostle School.

One of the highlights of this school year was the "State of the School" meeting held in December. The collaboration between the Administration, Staff, and Parents at the meeting was unprecedented. The Administration, School Board and Home and School Association joined forces to unveil the vision for the school in the areas of faith formation, technology enhancements, curriculum enhancement, professional development, and environmental projects. "Friend-raising" was introduced to help fund improvements. Although the school was unable to meet its targeted goal of raising \$100,000, a committee was formed to raise funds through grant writing. Other ways to increase revenue for curriculum, technology, and building enhancements are also being explored.

Additional highlights of the school year included: Halloween parties, a Student Appreciation 50's-style Sock Hop, the Craft Fair, performances by Good Counsel and the DeMatha Bands, 4th & 5th Grade Arts and Music Festival, participation of entire school in the weekly Mass, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, and quarterly confessions, the Travis Manion Foundation, Chinese New Year Lion Dance, Born for This, construction of the Early Learning Center which will provide year-round educational programs starting with infants 6 weeks of age through 2 years old, professional development in Responsive Classroom and technology, the Science Fair, STEM Night for girls, planting a pollinator and vegetable garden, and the school play-The Wizard of Oz.

It has been an eventful year, filled with hope, dreams, and anticipation of what is yet to come.

School News:

Much Loved Librarian Retires After 28 Years: Kim Bentley ('88)

It is rumored that my Mom, Lorraine Bentley, has read every book in the Saint Andrew's library.

Knowing that she's grown the library collection from 4,500 to over 14,000 books (14,479 to be exact!) in the time she's been there, it starts to sound like a very tall tale. But ask any student who's walked into her library with a vague description of what he's looking for (it's about a dog and has a blue cover...) and has had that book found and handed to him in minutes, it's hard to deny that rumor might be true.

This year, my Mom retires from 28 years at Saint Andrew's (31 if you count the years she volunteered) as the school's Librarian and Media Specialist. She has touched countless lives and turned many a reluctant student into an avid reader.

She is a fantastic storyteller, using traditional storytelling methods with puppets and flannel board.

She instigated a uniform research program called the Big6 throughout the school, building research skills from Kindergarten through 8th grade, her mantra being: "Googling is not research!"

She computerized the library circulation program and catalog in 1993, and has been online ever since.

The 1000-page Summer Reading Challenge she introduced in 2004 inspires both kids and parents to stay passionate about reading the entire year.

Her well-researched and thoughtful booklists and reviews for every

grade level each year are legendary and much sought after among fellow librarians and teachers outside of Saint Andrew's.

Lorraine has seen Saint Andrew's through 9 principals and 7 senior pastors, and she has had 5 wonderful aides. She moved the entire library twice, once to the convent, and then finally to a larger, double classroom in the new wing of the school.

She was hired in the fall of 1981 by Lynn White, the year I started 2nd grade. We were away from Saint Andrew's the fall of 1984. While Andy and I came back the spring of that same school year, my Mom spent the next 2 years working as staff at Montgomery County Public libraries and volunteering at Saint Andrew's. Mrs. Sampugnaro hired her back and funded her salary with, none other than, a chocolate sale.

Throughout all this change, one thing remained the same, her love

for reading and sharing that with kids.

Growing up with a librarian as a Mom is a wonderful gift and I'm so glad she was able to impart her knowledge, love, and passion for books and reading to so many others.

At her retirement party this past week, she quoted a favorite author, Gary Paulsen, from his book, *The Winter Room*: "If books could have more, give more, be more, show more, they would still need readers, who bring to them sound and smell and light and all the rest that can't be in books. The book needs YOU!"

I couldn't agree more.

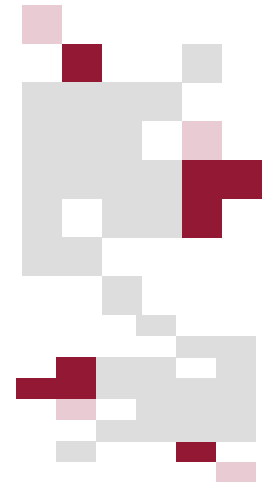
